# **Vegetation Balancing**

Extensive discussion has taken place on the Greens Committee, Ecology & Sustainability Committee and in Council, against a background of R&A / USGA advice, Scientific Papers, Research etc, on the need for Golf Courses to become more sustainable. This would cover such areas as the sustainable use of fertilisers, fungicides, herbicides etc, and how improvements to air and light circulation around the greens, tees and fairways will play a key role. The Ecology & Sustainability Committee and the Greens Committee are in complete agreement regarding this matter which also includes the need to remove all dead, dying and dangerous trees.

## Water Bottles, Bamboo Tees & Leather Golf Gloves



We have mentioned this in previous newsletters: Carl is still promoting the use of re-usable water bottles (with the Childwall Golf Club logo) and bamboo tees as two of our sustainability measures to reduce the use of plastic. He is also selling leather golf gloves (biodegradable) in recyclable packaging. A more sustainable option than synthetic (plastic) golf gloves.

Please consider these sustainable options.









## Wildlife News

- The Spring season has seen the return of many birds to CGC Chiffchaffs, Willow Warblers and Blackcaps have been heard singing around the golf course along with many of our other resident birds. A sure sign of Spring!
- Blue tits, Great tits and Nuthatches have been spotted investigating nest boxes.
- 10 pairs of Blue tits have been observed nesting in our boxes.
- A Blue tit has again decided to nest in the cigarette box on the upstairs lounge balcony.
- Kestrels have not yet taken up residence in the raptor box by the 10<sup>th</sup> green but this may still happen.
- The warm weather has brought out a number of butterflies including Orange Tip, Peacock and Speckled Wood.

#### Recent Sightings at CGC

- Redpolls, Siskins and a Brambling were spotted on the feeders during February and March along with our usual resident birds.
- Blue tits have been seen using nest boxes: 3, 19, 36, 74, 81, 82 and in an old Nuthatch tree nest hole on the 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Great tits are using nest box 30.
- We are hoping more nest boxes will become occupied. Please inform John Fox or Steve Young if you notice the occupation of any nest boxes (they are all numbered).
- A Kestrel has been seen in the new raptor box by the 13<sup>th</sup> green
